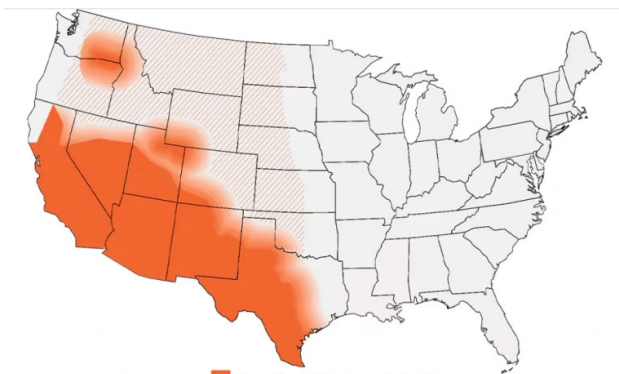

What Is Valley Fever?

Valley Fever (*coccidioidomycosis*) is a fungal infection found in the Southwestern U.S., especially California's southern San Joaquin Valley.

When to Get Tested

Consider testing if you have a cough for 2+ weeks, persistent fever/fatigue, night sweats, recent pneumonia, or work in dusty outdoor environments.

For Patients

Even if symptoms improve, Valley Fever can return. Ongoing care and blood titer monitoring are essential.



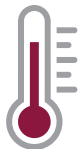
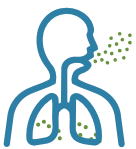

Why Monitoring Matters

Symptoms include cough, fever, fatigue, and chest pain, often resembling flu. Even after initial treatment, the disease can progress without follow-up. Regular monitoring helps detect complications such as chronic lung disease or meningitis.
